The preliminary estimate of the cost of the addition is \$2,000. Fifteen hundred dollars will be provided from Regional Quarters Operating Fund and \$500. from Area Quarters Operation.

#### A DOCUMENTARY HISTORY OF THE MAIN (WEST) GATE HOUSE

On March 27, 1898 the newspapers announced that "Norcross Brothers have contracted for the erection of three stone cottages on the Vanderbilt Estate. Work will be started at once. One of these structures (at the Post Road Entrance) is the subject of this report.

An item in Braman's Scrap Book dated June 25, 1898 states "The old undertaker house has been torn down and the cottage at the entrance of Mr. Vanderbilt's estate where Mr. Monahan lived will be moved to the grounds where the undertaking building 2 stood". The area cleared by this process is the site of the Main Gate House.

On July 31, 1898 the papers stated "The gate houses were designed by McKim, Meade & White, and the work performed by the contractors, 3

Norcross Brothers." This probably included the work on the gate houses.

In an interview with Construction Superintendent John B. Clermont by Historian Charles W. Snell on October 13, 1954, Mr. Clermont stated that "By contract, Nrocross Brothers completed all of the mansion except some of the interior decoration in that building.

All the other buildings constructed by Norcross were finished to the 4 last detail and ready for habitation."

On December 4, 1898 the papers stated that "Norcross Brothers 5 have completed their part of the work at Vanderbilt Mansion."

This building is a two-story house constructed of Indiana limestone with a copper roof. There are five rooms and one bath. In 1940, the building was heated by an open type, gravity circulation, hand fired, coal burning, cast iron boiler located in the basement. Domestic hot water was supplied by a water-back in the coal fired kitchen range and in the summer by an oil-fired heater located near the range. The electrical wiring in the structure dated from 1898. There was no telephone in the house. Water for domestic and protection purposes was supplied to the gate house by the estate water system. Drinking water was obtained from a well located by the building. Sewage from the house was disposed of in a nearby cesspool.

After the acquisition of the estate in 1940 by the Government as a National Historic Site, a P.W.A. grant of \$9,550.00, enabled the Park Service to modernize the heating, plumbing and electrical systems, make roof repairs and adapt this building for employee living quarters. These alterations were completed by the end of 1941.
